2. Name the protagonist, the antagonist and describe each by using 5 - 7 sentences, including their strengths & weakness
3. Setting: where & when does the story take place?
4. Name two minor characters & list tree facts about each
5. Describe the climax using 5 -7 sentences
6. Explain the climax using 5 -7 sentences
7. Explain the Resolution using 5 -7 sentences
8. Select two quotes {2 – 3 sentences each} and explain it in your own words as it applies to the story; list the page number of the quote
9. Explain the theme using 8 – 10 sentences

AP Literature: Select 1 of the 2 novels that was read and complete the following in addition to the above assignment:

✚ Constructs three why & three how questions

1. Answer your constructed questions and give the page numbers for the answers
2. Use 3 - 5 sentences for each answer
